

## **Shadowing & Observation of Occupational Therapy Experiences**

## **Occupational Therapy Exploration!**

Occupational therapy practitioners have the opportunity to work in many diverse and unique settings, with clients of all ages and abilities. To obtain a better understanding of the occupational therapy profession, potential applicants are asked to explore the profession using a variety of modalities. A minimum of 10 observational hours is preferred but not required. Completion of 15 hours of OT Exploration is required for those who have 10 hours of observation hours (25 hours of OT Exploration for those who do not have observation hours), and it is expected that applicants will engage in at least 2 different experiences that focus on different ages and settings. The chart below should be used to document your experiences, and the reflection questions should be answered. A document with the completed chart and reflection questions should be submitted in OTCAS as part of your application. Possible modalities to explore the profession include watching a movie; reading a book, journal article or professional publication; listening to a TED talk or podcast; participating in an Introduction to Occupational Therapy course; watching a video on YouTube or the American Occupational Therapy website; conducting an interview with a profession-related website.
