

Online and Distance Education Professional Licensure Contact

A state's laws may require practitioners to be licensed to practice in that state.

The paragraphs below list the fields in which our online or distance education programs fulfill academic requirements leading to licensure and the states in which licensure may be granted.

Nursing

Winston-Salem State offers Nursing programs online and at distance sites in these professional areas:

- Bachelor of Science in Nursing (RN-BSN) (online and distance sites)
- Master of Science in Nursing Advanced Educator (ANE) Concentration

Both RN-BSN and ANE students are already licensed and neither are required to sit for additional certification. In order to enroll in either program, the students must be licensed in the state of NC to apply. Winston-Salem State University does not accept applications from other states.

The baccalaureate and master's degree programs in nursing at Winston-Salem State University are accredited by the [Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education](#).

Clinical Laboratory Sciences

Winston-Salem State offers a degree program online in this professional area:

- Bachelor of Science-Clinical Laboratory Science

Students from all states may apply for admission. Upon completion of the program, graduates may apply for licensure in the state of North Carolina, but are not required to do so. Some states currently require professionals to hold licensure.

Rehabilitation Counseling

Winston-Salem State offers a degree program online in this professional area:

- Master of Science in Rehabilitation Counseling

The MSRC program provides students with the opportunity to earn a master's degree in rehabilitation counseling and to become eligible to take the national Certified Rehabilitation Counselor (CRC) examination.

The [Council for Accreditation of Counseling and Related Educational Programs](#) (CACREP) is the accrediting body for graduate level rehabilitation counseling programs.

Students from all states may apply for admission. Upon completion of the program, graduates may apply for licensure in the state of North Carolina.
