North Carolina Community College Student Transfer Credit Review

- 1) Review transcript for Accreditation
 - a) Must be Regionally accredited when student took course work
 - b) Check to make sure correct student is being reviewed
 - i) DOB
 - ii) Student name (current and previous names listed)
 - iii) Social Security number if available
 - c) Review transcript for credit type (semester, quarter or other)
- 2) Check Transcript for any degrees earned.
 - a) Students with a North Carolina earned AA or AS degree receive up to 64 credits
 - i) Students receive all areas of knowledge
 - ii) Credits added in as a block of up to 64 credits are the maximum credits that may be awarded
 - iii) Review course work for pre-requisites or direct transfer. These courses will be brought in course by course and deducted from the 64 credits
- 3) For students who did not earn and AA/AS Degree
 - i) Up to 64 credits from Community Colleges can be brought in for transfer
 - Review courses for areas of knowledge (Literature, Historical Studies, Social/Behavioral Science, Natural Sciences, Mathematics and Quantitative Logic, Fine Arts, and Foreign Language and Culture).
 - iii) Review coursework that can be transferred into students major coursework
 - iv) Bring in coursework if more than 64 credits that will most help the student towards graduation requirements.
 - b) Student with a previously earned BA or BS degree will receive 90 credits
 - i) Credits will be brought in as a block of 90 credits
 - ii) Review transcript for courses that can be pre-requisites
 - iii) Review courses for direct transfer for major courses
 - iv) Courses that are brought in for pre-requisites or direct transfer will be deducted for the 90 credit block.
 - c) Students with multiple transcripts can earn up to 90 semester credits total
 - i) Up to 64 from community college level
 - ii) Up to 90 credits from 4 year institutions
 - iii) A maximum of 30 credits of electives can be transferred
