Election Qualifications

- Must a student of Winston-Salem State University and have been for at least two semesters prior to election.
- Must have completed the appropriate hours required for the position sought and not have any incompletes on transcript.
- Must be a full-time student and continuously enrolled during the academic year in which the office is held.
- Must have a minimum cumulative GPA of a 2.7 at the time of application and maintain, while in office, a minimum of a 2.5 cumulative GPA.
 - All students applying for the position of SGA President must have a minimum cumulative GPA of a 3.0 at the time of application and maintain, while in office, a minimum 2.7 cumulative GPA.
- Must not be on academic probation and/or must not have been found guilty of any student conduct violation resulting in penalties of probation, suspension, or expulsion.

Election Procedures

- All regularly enrolled students shall be members of the Student Government Association with rights to vote in all elections.
- Tentative Election Schedule
 - Executive Board - First Wednesday in April of each year
 - Sophomore, Junior, Senior Class Council - First Wednesday in April of each year
 - Freshman Class Council - First Wednesday in September of each year
- If any Class Council positions are not filled during the election period, the president representing that class may fill the open positions however he/she sees fit in consultation with the Student Body President.
- These elected officers shall hold office for one year as long as they uphold the dignities of the office (must not be on social or academic probation).
